When it is safe again and the restrictions have been lifted we already have two tours funded and in their planning stages


New adventures

- Circus skills involve both the left and right side of the body and the brain to greatly improve learning abilities.
- Circus skills help people to deal with fear, react to the unexpected and plunge into the next challenge with confidence.
